Dear Governor Shapiro:

First, let us wish you and your family a happy and productive summer on behalf of the Black Political Empowerment Project (B-PEP).

Soon, you will be appointing Judges to the Superior Court of Pennsylvania and to the Court of Common Pleas Fifth District in Allegheny County. The Black Political Empowerment Project (B-PEP) asks that you appoint African-American judges to fill the vacancies in these courts.

It is the mission of B-PEP that "African Americans VOTE in EACH and EVERY Election!", but also, that those in elected and appointed positions expeditiously and effectively meet the needs, aspirations, and concerns of the African-American residents they serve. This part of B-PEP's mission includes the judiciary, which is considered the last resort in resolving disputes and helping to provide justice to the citizens of Allegheny County and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

The 2020 U.S. Census says that 13.5% of Allegheny County residents are African Americans, while the population of African Americans in the Allegheny County jail stands above 66% as of the date of this letter.

With only one African-American judge on the Superior Court, its composition is 5.6-6.7% African American (depending on whether one includes senior judges). We believe the appointment of a qualified African-American judge to fill the vacancy created by the election of Judge McCaffrey to the Supreme Court will not cure the disparities and discrimination that African Americans have endured, but will at least be a step in the right direction.

With only six African Americans out of 43 judges on the Court of Common Pleas of Allegheny County, with only one serving in the Criminal Division where over 60% of its defendants are persons of color, it is hard to fathom a sense of justice in the minds of the majority of defendants who come before this court. There are far too many African Americans coming before the bench, and too few sitting behind the bench.
